How to set up Wi-Fi

WIFI Settings for MAC OS X

Open your **System Preferences** application. It is listed in the pull down menu under the **Apple Menu**.



Or

Open **System Preferences** from the dock



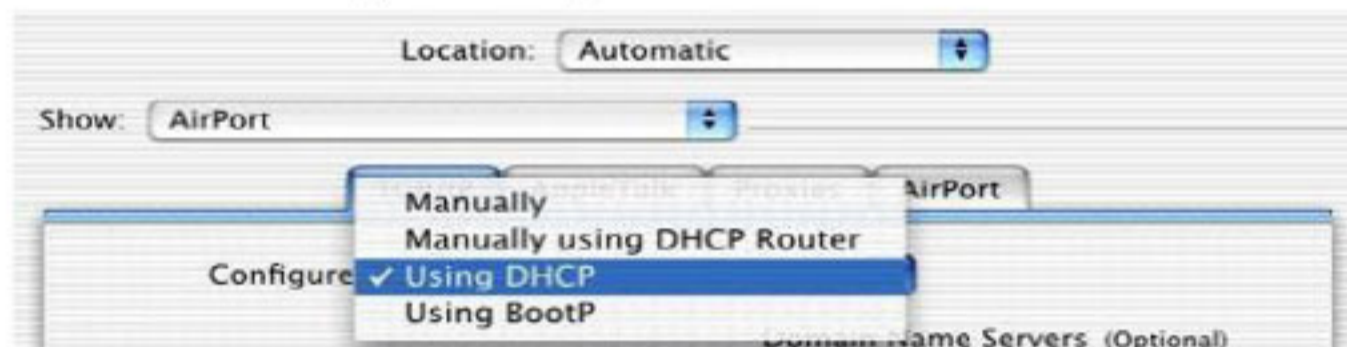
Within System Preferences, select **Network**.



Set **Location** to **Automatic** and set **Show** to **AirPort**. If you are unable to select AirPort, select Active Network Ports and make sure AirPort is selected.



Under the **TCP/IP** tab, set **Configure** to **Using DHCP**.



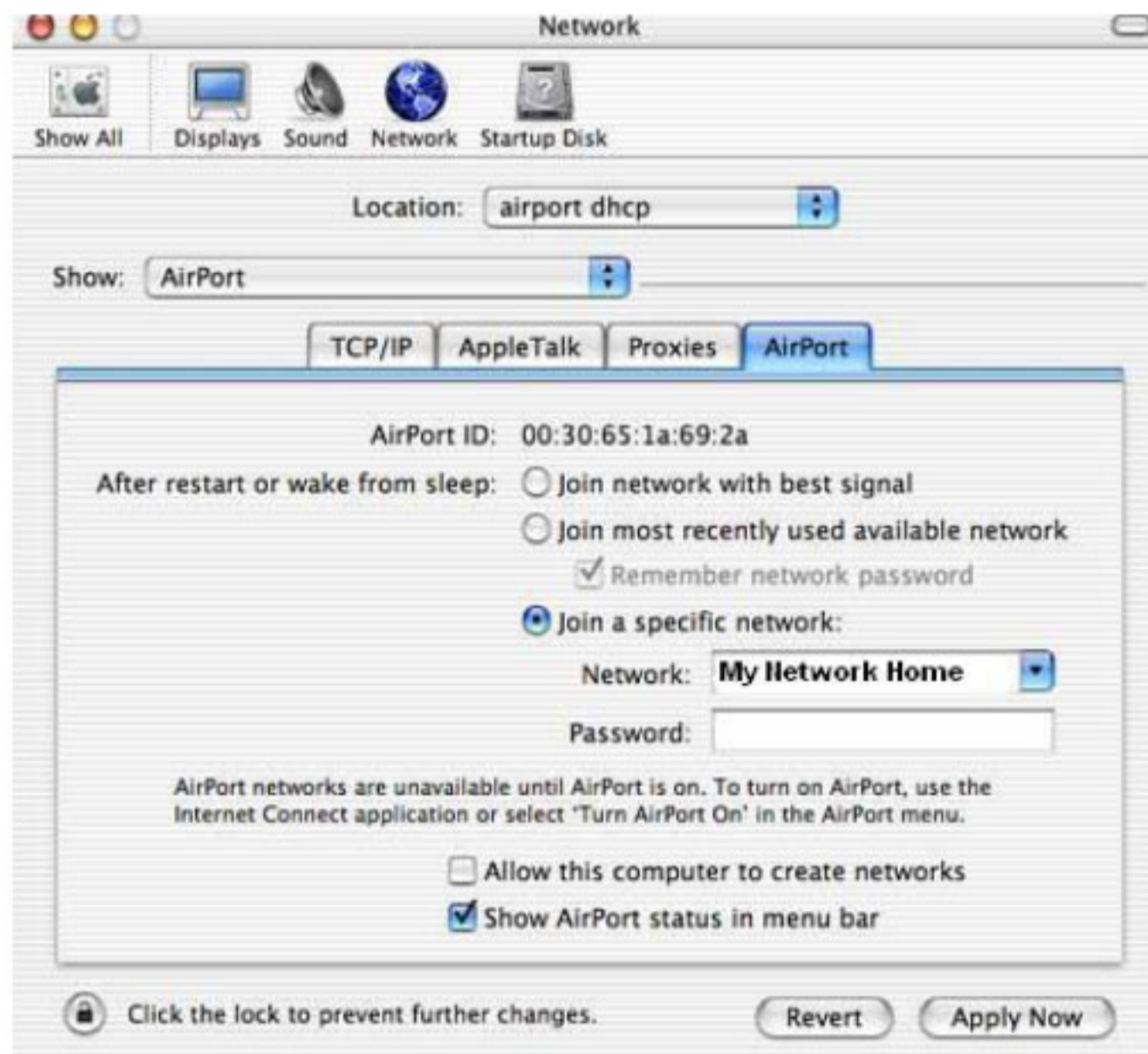
Select the AirPort tab

The **Preferred Network** (Mac OS X 10.1.5) or **Network** (Mac OS X 10.2 and later) should be set to "**My Network Home**" (This wireless network name is also known as the SSID)

The **Network Password** should be typed in; this is usually the WPA (Wi-Fi Protected Access) or WEP (Wired Equivalent Privacy) key.

Uncheck the **Allow this computer to create networks** box (Mac OS X 10.2 and later)

Check the **Show AirPort status in menu bar** box. This creates a menu that displays the Wireless Access Point's signal strength, and lets you quickly turn on and off your AirPort card



To preserve any changes you have made click on the "Save" button ("Apply Now" in Mac OS 10.1), then close the network window and your system preferences window.
